2 Timothy 2: 22(a)

Flee also youthful lusts;

Flee sexual immorality. Every sin that a man does is outside the body, but he who commits sexual immorality sins against his own body. Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit *who is* in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own?

Flee failure

Pursue Perfection

Pursue –

aggressively chase, like a *hunter* pursuing a catch (prize); ***earnestly*** **desiring to overtake (apprehend)**

Therefore, **submit** to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you. **Draw near to God** and He will draw near to you. Cleanse *your* hands, *you* sinners; and purify *your* hearts, *you* double-minded.

1 Timothy 6: 11

But you, O man of God, flee these things (love of money; a root of all kinds of evil) and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, gentleness.

Pursue Perfection

purpose; completeness or maturity

**Stop Striving
For Perfection**

The word *perfect, perfected, perfectly* or *perfection* is used in 80 verses in the NKJV of the Bible; 45 times in the NT.

Philippians 3: 12-13

Not that I have already attained, or am already **perfected**; but I **press on**, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me.

Brethren, I do not count myself to have apprehended; but **one thing I do**, forgetting those things which are behind and **reaching forward** to those things which are ahead,

2 Corinthians 12: 8-9

Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. And He said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness.”

Hebrews 6: 1-2

Therefore, leaving the discussion of the elementary *principles* of Christ, **let us go on to perfection**, not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, of the doctrine of baptisms, of laying on of hands, of resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment.
