THE PURSUIT OF



The Cambridge Dictionary has several definitions for *pursuit*; two of them are "the act of trying to achieve a plan, activity, or situation, usually over a long period of time," and "an activity that you spend time and energy doing."

The American Heritage Dictionary defines *excellence* as "The <u>state</u>, <u>quality</u>, or condition of excelling; superiority." The word **<u>excel</u>** is defined as, "to do or be better than; surpass; to show superiority, surpass others."

A prominent part of those words means competition or being better than others. But when we think of the pursuit of excellence from a biblical standpoint, is that what is meant?

"<u>Success</u> means being the best. <u>Excellence</u> means being your best."

<u>Success</u>, to many, means being better than everyone else. It means exceeding the achievements of other people. **Excellence** means being better today than you were yesterday and tomorrow than today. It means matching your practice (habits) with your potential.

The pursuit of excellence is never a matter of simply choosing between what is good or bad, but choosing what is best or superior because it better enables us to accomplish what God has designed us to be and do.

The <u>pursuit of excellence</u> must include the elimination of some things <u>even though</u> they may be good and legitimate. All things are lawful for me, but not all things are helpful; all things are lawful for me, but not all things edify. Let no one seek his own, but each one the other's well-being.

1 Corinthians 10: 23-24

Imitate me, just as I also *imitate* Christ.

1 Corinthians 11: 1

Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; <u>but I</u> <u>press on</u>, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me.

Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ,

The <u>Pursuit of Excellence</u> is not a matter of chance; it is a matter of choice.
